

Solano Valley Church Next Step Campaign 2018

a letter from Pastor Gary 🖘



I have had the privilege and joy of pastoring Solano Valley Church from being a small group Bible study of a dozen people meeting in our home to the church we have become today. In the past two-years we have helped launch four new churches by giving away two full Sunday offerings of over \$20,000, and this summer we mobilized dozens of people in our church to love and serve the people of our community through Week of Hope. Also, in our Celebration of Hope BBQ and concert, we shared the gospel with 190 people. Solano Valley Church is a disciple-making church that is planting disciple-making churches.

Our community is strategically located between San Francisco and Sacramento. It is the home of Travis Air Force Base and is the seat of the Solano County government. It is part of the most ethnically diverse metropolitan area in the nation. For many people, it is a bedroom community where they sleep at night while commuting to another community for work by day. And it is one of the most unchurched communities in the entire nation. It is filled with tens of thousands of people who need the hope we have in Christ.

The people of our community struggle with many things including: busy lives and over-extended schedules, financial pressures, strained relationships, inner turmoil, emptiness, loneliness, shattered marriages, fractured families, broken hearts, and many people have little or no connection with God.

This community needs our church more than ever. It needs us to be healthy. It needs us to be faithful in loving them, serving them, praying for them, and reaching out to them. Our community needs us to be Next Step followers of Jesus – people who are eager to the take the next step in following Jesus and living His mission in our community.

Our Next Step Campaign has a financial component that will help us take an important step in being able to purchase a future home for our church. But Next Step is about so much more than raising money to purchase a future home for our church.

It is about each of us individually and all of us collectively being eager to take the next step in following Jesus and living His mission in our community.



Facts and Figures

Why do we need a campaign?



In the early days of Solano Valley Church, we met in Pastor Gary and Joy's home. Through God's blessing, we were able to reach an agreement with the school district to use B. Gale Wilson Elementary School for our morning services. However, certain aspects of our ministry were limited due to us not having a space of our own. That's when we recognized that God was leading us to make a bold move in our walk of faith to relocate to our leased facility on Oliver Road.



We have been in our current leased space since 2003. The Landlord has been most gracious to allow us to lease our current space for the next seven years through 2024. However, our landlord has expressed his desire to sell his California properties in the future. With the seven years ahead of us, we feel God is leading us to prepare now and accumulate enough money to make a down payment on a permanent home for SVC.



In order to have room for growth, we have reconfigured our current location, but we are limited in our space to expand. Expansion will allow our ministries and outreach to grow in our ability to impact our community.

Some may feel our church is the perfect size and think, "Why do we need to grow?" The answer is simple. Jesus said in Mathew 28:19, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In addition, Luke 12:48 says, "...to whom much is given, much is required". We recognize we have been given much...grace, love, talent, and the call of God to do far more. As long as there are people far from God in our community, we have the opportunity to invite them to follow Jesus to be more like Him.

We know the church isn't a building; our members are the church. However, a permanent church home will enhance our ministry work.

Success with The Next Step Campaign, starts with everyone coming together in seeking God daily through our 40 Days of Prayer guide. In addition, we are embarking

on a 24-month journey of a whole new level of trusting God. Through sincere diligent prayer, willingness to be used by God, and simple obedience to the leading of the Holy Spirit, we believe God will see this goal come to fruition.

We also know there are steps of self-discipline, faith, and obedience required in preparing and saving for what God has in store for us. Let us not shy away from what God wants to accomplish in us. This is an exciting time of seeking God's will, obeying His direction, and watching Him work in us and through us.

Our new church home will require funding. In order to fulfill the goal of growth and reaching people for Christ, we as a church body will make a financial commitment. It is important to remember who provides. God is our great provider, and everything He entrusts to us should be viewed as His provision.

Though we don't currently know where SVC's permanent home will be, we do know God is calling us to prepare. Together we can give the resources needed as we walk in faith and obedience. We know a building does not change lives-but what happens inside the church does.

the Next Step in the journey

prayer

First, we are asking every person to commit to pray through the 40 Days of Prayer guide. The most important aspect to the Next Step Campaign is prayer. The goal is spiritual growth, so we would like to see each person take time each day to be still in God's presence over the next 40 days. The 40 Days of Prayer guide will help you through your personal journey of prayer and devotion in pursuing God.

humble obedience

Hearing from God starts with a commitment to humble obedience. As you commit to prayer, orient yourself toward a posture of obedience from the beginning. Approach God with a willing heart to say "YES" in how he leads you to respond to the prayer, "How do you want me to invest my life in building your Kingdom?"

document your journey

Documenting your personal experience is an important part of this campaign. There are multiple ways for you to do this. Record your journey in your 40 Days of Prayer guide. Also, take notes from Pastor Gary's sermon series and record them on pages 17-25 of this brochure. Open you heart to God and ask Him what your Next Step should be.

commitment to grow

We are asking you to spend time with God every day, reading His word and praying. Above all, we want the people of Solano Valley Church growing closer to God and positioning themselves to take the Next Step in their relationship with Jesus.

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5-6

commitment to give

Beyond praying, we are asking you to consider how God wants you to trust Him in giving toward the Next Step Campaign. We are asking every person to make a two-year

financial commitment above and beyond what you are already giving in tithes. As you talk with God about what's on your heart and mind, be open and honest, especially in relation to this giving commitment. This should not be about guilt or obligation but about God's perspective.


